Dear Friends,

Sometimes life comes in big, bold waves. Dennis and I have been keenly aware of this as, in this past month, we have been navigating his recovery from open-heart surgery and our grief for the death of my mother. It has been a profound time for both of us, when we've been blessed by support and prayer from friends near (you!) and far. Your care gives warmth to our sense of God's nearness and care. Thank you!

One of our Presbyterian friends, who now lives in that state up north (but don't hold that against him), recalled receiving a similar kind of care years ago when he recovered from major surgery. He said it reminded him of a concept from one of Robert Coles' books, how we are "handed along" in life by a whole succession of people. This surely is part of what we mean when we speak of the "communion" we have in the Holy Spirit. Through whatever we face in life, we are not alone.

This is not only a comfort, but a strength we bring to any challenge in life, including violence in our schools and menacing words from old national enemies. We are not alone. We have been handed a Truth that is stronger than any threat, anything that stirs up our fear. That Truth is the Empty Tomb, God's victory which draws Life from precisely the spot where Death has piled its spoils. The Resurrection of Jesus Christ means that Death—while present, powerful, and pernicious—is nevertheless a defeated enemy and a slave to the eternal purposes of Life. We are not alone.

Again, Dennis and I thank you for the whole variety of ways you prayed and cared for us—you gave testimony to the power of Life. Our hearts rejoice to be a part of this church community!

PALM SUNDAY, MARCH 25

Worship Services

8 a.m., 10 a.m., & 5 p.m.

We begin Holy Week with Jesus' Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem. All services will feature palm branches. "Parade" for children at 10 a.m. Dr. Julia Wharff Piermont, preaching.

MAUNDY THURSDAY, MARCH 29

Communion Service at 7 p.m.

We join Jesus and the disciples at the Last Supper, where Jesus calls us into the "New Covenant." This service features the music of the Chancel Choir, sermon by Dr. Tom Rice, and communion served by intinction (dipping bread into a common cup).

GOOD FRIDAY, MARCH 30

***Community Ecumenical Service
on the Village Green at 12 noon***

***Tenebrae Service
Sanctuary at 7 p.m.***

Worthington churches unite for an outdoor service, with readings, prayer, and singing around the Village Green, accompanied by the Salvation Army brass. We begin on our Sanctuary steps and conclude with a reception at St. John's Episcopal Church.

Rev. Wayne Morrison will lead a simple service of readings and music to remember the crucifixion of Jesus. "Tenebrae" is Latin for "darkness," and refers to the tradition of increasing darkness as we hear the readings. In our service, candles will be extinguished, and we will end in the darkness of Good Friday.

8:00 a.m., 9:30 a.m., & 11:15 a.m.

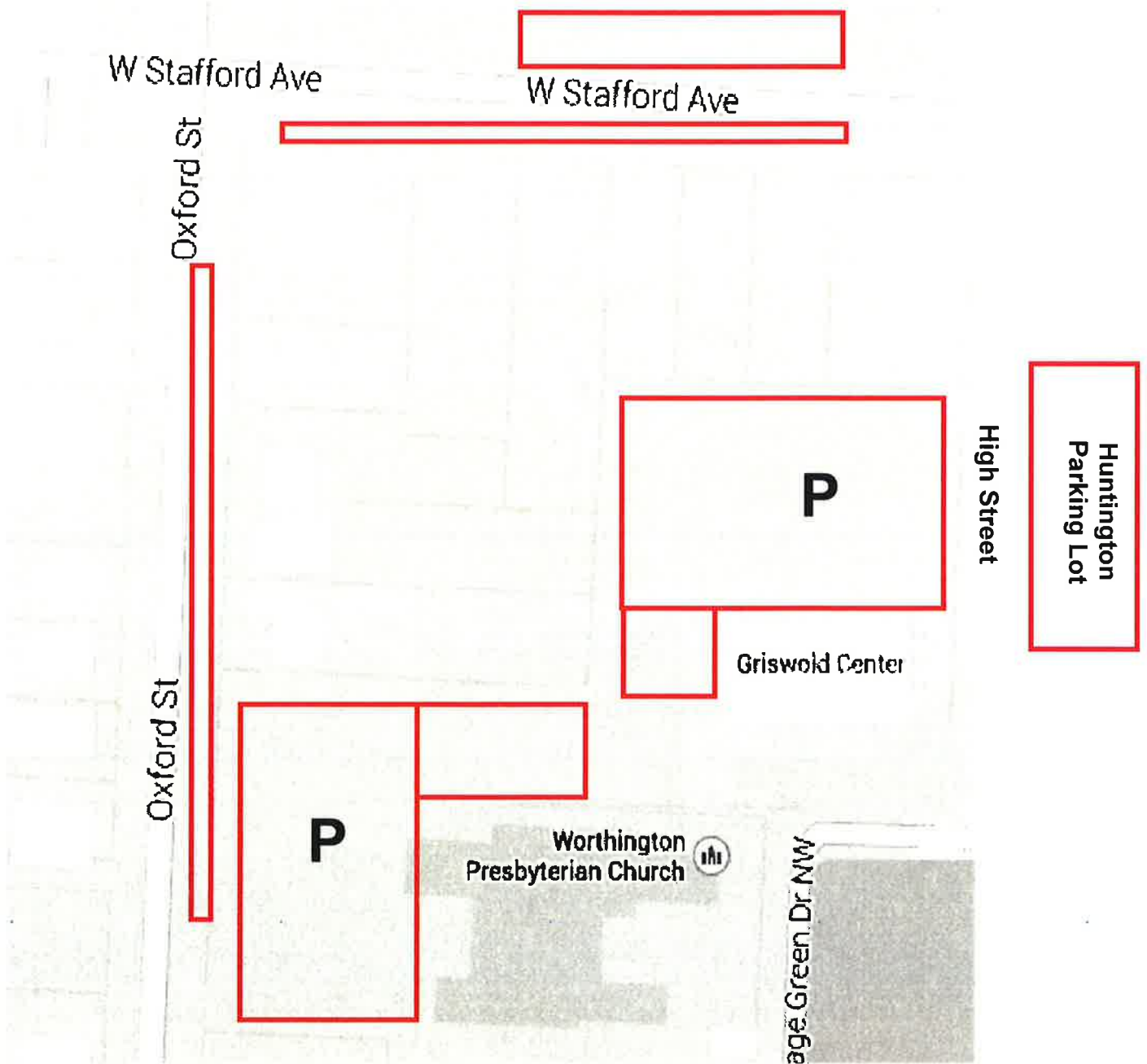
