Dear Friends,

Welcome to the summer edition of our newsletter. I am writing this on the last day of school for the Worthington district, which brings back wonderful memories. My family had a tradition of going to Dairy Queen, and it was the one day of the year we could choose anything on the menu—great fun! Let's wish all of our children, teens, and their families a wonderful summer, full of blessings.

A month ago Dennis and I were in Iowa and Illinois for my mother's memorial services. It was a meaningful time in many ways, and one way related to what it means to belong to a specific church community, in our case, Presbyterian. The memorial service was in my home town and home church, 600 miles from here, yet the pastor who served us (an associate pastor of that congregation) grew up in Hilliard. Some of you may know her, the Rev. Beth Hilkerbaumer, the daughter of a former WPC interim pastor, the Rev. Janice Hilkerbaumer. And the committal service, at the cemetery of my mother's hometown in Illinois, was conducted by the chaplain of nearby Monmouth College, my parents' alma mater and a Presbyterian college.

Even though my family made arrangements long-distance and dealt with people unknown to us, everything—and everyone—nevertheless felt familiar and comfortable because of our common Presbyterian ties. They were ready to help and knew what we needed because we share common experiences, vocabulary, and hopes.

Denominational Christianity is not exactly in vogue these days, yet it made all the difference to us that weekend. The next time someone asks you why you're a Presbyterian, consider saying, "Because it means being part of a great big family, who know how to help in any kind of need." As one of our hymns goes: "The love that made us, makes us one and strangers now are friends."

This summer we will read several of the wonderful Christian books we have in our church library. The children will go to the Chapel after the Children’s Message: (ages 4 years – 6th grade)

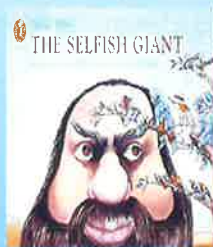

She does everything she can to support the kids both in and out of the classroom. She was also patient with me and without her help I would not have been able to accomplish my goals or contribute to the work at MdL so completely. She spoke Spanish slowly and clearly and made sure I understood. After some time I began to help her practice English. Remembering her patience and how difficult it was for me when I could not understand, I was able to better help her develop an understanding of English. I am headed to OSU in the fall to study Industrial and Systems Engineering, but especially after my time in the school at MdL I am considering teaching as a second career after some time in the corporate world. The support from my family and friends, knowing that they were thinking of me and praying every day, kept me in good spirits and helped me make the most impact during my time abroad.
