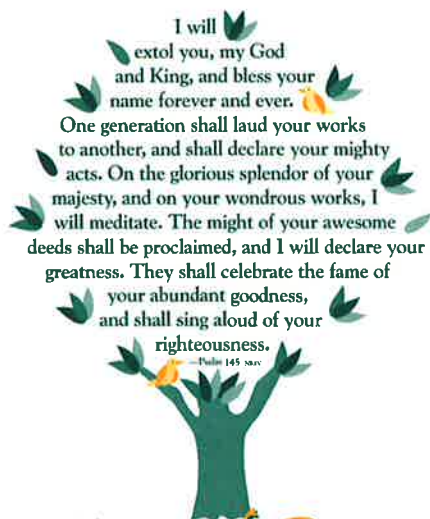

CROP HUNGER WALK

ENDING HUNGER ONE STEP AT A TIME

Worthington will hold its Tenth Annual CROP Walk for Hunger on Sunday, October 14th. Our congregation will participate along with other Worthington churches, civic organizations, and high school students.

Walkers will meet at 3:00 p.m. at the former Methodist Children's Home (across from the fire station) and can choose either a 1 mile or 5K (3.1 miles) marked route.

25% of the money raised from our walk will benefit the Worthington Resource Pantry; 75% of the funds raised will be used by Church World Service to fight hunger in the nation or in areas around the world.

To date we have 3 teams forming for the walk:

- our Teens
- our "Faith Runners"
- a WPC team (anyone else who would like to walk to end hunger)

TURNING POINT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

A presentation by Delaware County Sheriff Russell Martin on Domestic Violence and the new "Turning Point" domestic shelter will be on Tuesday, October 16th at 7:00 p.m. in Fellowship Hall. We have met Sheriff Martin at recent Sunday "Minute for Mission" as he shared his concerns and faith. Sheriff Martin indicates domestic violence is among the most common types of incidents to which our law enforcement officers respond – second only to theft. He is committed to establishing a safe haven – Turning Point – for victims and families.

Domestic violence is an equal opportunity crime. It crosses all boundaries and demographics without regard to gender, age and economic status. Both WPC as a church and Presbyterian Women United have pledged financial assistance to Turning Point. Come! Learn about how we can support the shelter's mission to respond to the needs of victims through a safe shelter, counseling advocacy and education that will confront the causes of domestic violence. WPC Adult Education and Presbyterian Women United are sponsoring this program. Come at 6:30 p.m. for coffee and dessert.

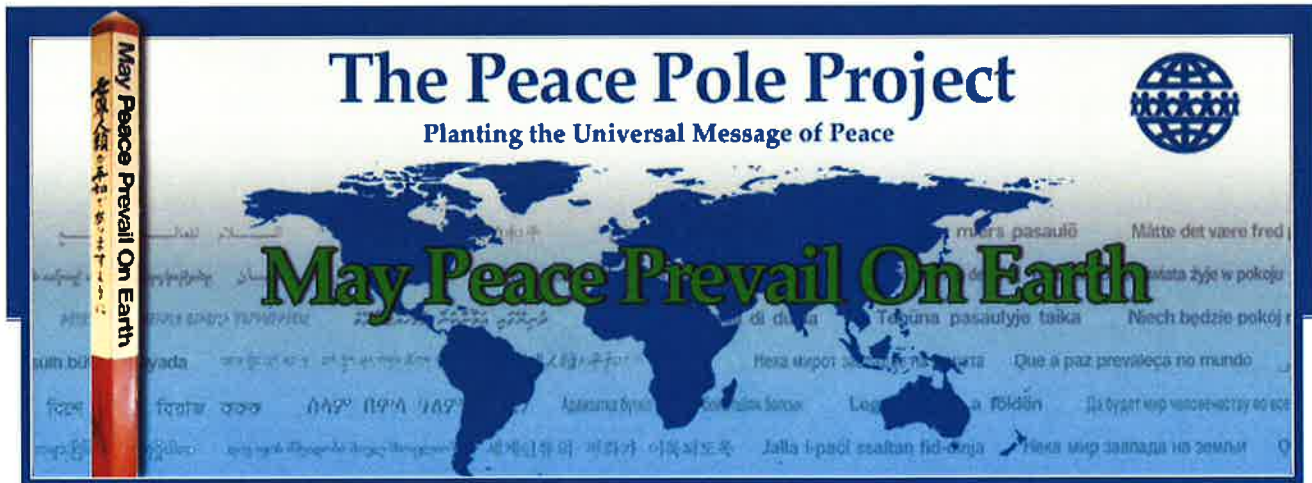
